For our final prayer service, we formed *statio*. In this Benedictine tradition, the Sisters line up in silence to enter the monastery chapel two by two. Each pair bows to the altar and then to each other before being seated. Sister Judith Ann Heble, the CIB moderator, led the service in which we all blessed each other and sent each other off to be witnesses of hope in our own communities and regions.
